**ACTION**

**1. Minutes of the Last Meeting**

In the heading of paragraph no. 2, 'of 1998 Council' should be deleted.  
 In first line of paragraph 3a 'return' should be replaced by 'returned' and in the second line 'authorized' should be replaced by 'authorize'.  
 In first line of paragraph 3e 'averaged' should be replaced by "average".

**2. Matters arising from the minutes of the last meeting**

AC reported that Stephen Kwok, Kathy Lee and Laurance Lo had agreed to serve the Tournament Operation Committee.  
 The dealing machine shipped to Sweden were not available for CBA's use due to deferred return.  
 SW had sent the invoice to AIA to collect the sum for student event. DZ would try to contact AIA for sponsorship for Intercity Championships.  
 The Youth Team Trial results had been posted on website.

**3a. PABF 1999**

The results of the teams were as follows:

**Open Team:** positioned at 11 out of 12

**Women Team:** positioned 6 out of 9 and gained a berth to attend Venice Cup

**Youth Team:** positioned 3 out of 7 and gained a berth to attend World Junior Bridge Team Championship

Captain's reports from both the Women Team and Youth Team were received and adopted with minor spelling amendment. DZ would follow up with Simon Hui for Captain's report for Open Team.

The venue for 2000 PABF would be Indonesia and the tentative venue for 2001 PABF would be Singapore.

**3b. Intercity 1999**

12 teams were registered for the local Open Teams Trial. Trial would be held on 3 and 4 of July. 1 Women Team had been registered. AC would send e-mail again to Japan, Thailand, Indonesia and Singapore to appeal for more support. IH would contact Taiwan and DZ would write to China for more team registration.

AC reported that \$169,000 sponsorship had been confirmed and invoice would be sent. It was also agreed that an assistant Director would be invited from China to serve the Tournament. DZ would cover up the difference between hiring a local assistant Director and the Chinese Director. It was also agreed that souvenir would be given to Robert Zajac as well as a life membership in view of the years' service as Bulletin Editor in Intercity.

**3c. Finance**

SW reported that a deficit of \$22,330 was recorded since last meeting. The main reason for this was distribution of prize points. It was agreed that more effort would be exerted to recover account receivable. To take into account normal tournament a surplus of \$4,390 was recorded.

**3d. Roster for Paul Jones Duplicate pairs**

IM would serve for July and Daniel Chui would serve for August.

**3e. Membership and Attendance of Tournaments**

SW reported that the average number of tables in May tournaments was 11.3, and 13.1 for June so far. It was observed that BT and other Council members had tried to keep more members playing.  
 249 members had joined the Association. SW reminded the Directors that players for the Intercity Trial must be members of the Association. The Council still aimed at in-taking a minimum of 300 members by the end of the year. SK would approach students during the Rose Bowl Tournament for joining the Association.

**a. Meeting of Sports Federation & Olympic Committee of Hong Kong**

**b. Laws and Rules**

PABF had resolved that the amendments of Law 12C(3), Law 18F, Law 61B and Law 93B(1) be adopted by the PABF Tournaments. The Council resolved that the same applied to HKCBA tournaments. For Brown Sticker System for those bids protected by system, the Association resolved that it was not allowed for all tournaments held by HKCBA. AC would try to update all Directors and publish in Bridglette.

- c. Venice Cup  
The Women Team members had not confirmed whether they would attend Venice Cup in Bermuda or not. It was resolved that a deadline by 15 July 1999 be set for final decision of the team members. CC would inform Stephen Kwok about this. CC
- d. World Junior Bridge Team Championship  
Two of the original team members were beyond the age limit set by WBF. Yau Ngai and WK Lai were nominated to replace the two members and adopted by the council. JM was nominated as the NPC of the WJC Youth Team. CC would handle the registration matters. CC
- e. Letter from Fantana Waller  
A letter received from Fantana Waller was received in seeking clarification about the accused 'last minute withdrawal' of her from the 1996 Olympiad Team. CC would find out the minutes and write to Fantana to explain. CC
- f. Director's Course  
Deadline for registration would be on 6 July 1999 and the course would be started in July
- g. Prize Point for Open League  
The published amount of prize points for Open League was incorrect due to change of Tournament format. It was resolved that the correct amount for the winning team would be \$15 with retrospective effect.
- h. Tournament on 24 September 1999  
The day would be Mid-Autumn Festival which was not appropriate for arranging tournament. It was agreed that the Life Master Pairs would be rescheduled to a weekend and a pair game would be held on 28 September 1999. CW would look for the date and send notice to members. CW
- i. Centenary Cup  
CY, Ella Graca, Robert Zajac and Samme Lee would attend the tournament.
5. Date of Next Meeting  
The date of next Meeting would be on 19 July 1999 at the same venue. There being no other business and the meeting was adjourned at 8:30 p.m.

2. Matters arising from the minutes of the last meeting  
Captain's report from Open Team was still outstanding. DZ would follow up with Simon Hui for the report. DZ  
CW would issue notice informing the change of tournament schedule on 24 and 28 of September 1999. CW
- 3a. Venice Cup and World Junior Bridge Team Championship  
For Venice Cup, only two members of the original Hong Kong Team confirmed they would go. It was determined that berth should be open for all women players of the HKCBA. Announcement would be sent to invite registration in teams and the dead-line would be 15 August 1999. CW  
JM was not able to go to USA as Team Captain for WJBTC. It was agreed that DC would serve as the captain and Laurance Lo of the team.
- 3b. Intercity 1999  
AC reported that \$212,000 sponsorship had been confirmed and \$166,000 received already. 34 teams had registered and AC would follow up for any more registration. AC
- 3c. Finance  
SW reported that a surplus of \$26,358.75 was recorded since last meeting. The reason for this was good attendance for the events held during the period.
- 3d. Roster for Paul Jones Duplicate Pairs

As DC would be out of Hong Kong, SK would serve for August.

3e. Membership and Attendance of Tournaments

SW reported that the average number of tables in June tournament was 13.3, and 16 for July. The tournament operations committee would review the tournament formats and make proposal to the Council for 2000 to boost up attendance.

276 members had joined the Association. SW remarked that in certain tournament the Directors had not asked non-member to join the Association. KC would remind Directors to make players join the Association or pay the non-member's fee.

## 1999 Pacific Asia Championship -Youth Team Captain's Report

The championship took place in Hangzhou, China from May 21, 1999 to May 30, 1999. A total of seven teams took part in the competition. The competition format was three round-robin to decide the winner, and the two highest score amongst zone 6 NCBO's would earn the right to represent this zone in the Junior Championship that is going to take place in Florida, USA in August 1999.

The selection of youth team was by pair, assessment made on individual pairs performance in Swiss pair organised by the Association as well as results on specific tests and attendance record. In the end, the three pairs selected were Cheung Lik - CK Poon, WK Hon - Laurence Lo, Deniel Tsui - Simon Wong.

Derek Zen was appointed by the Council as the non-playing captain. Six training sessions were conducted prior to the championship. My main focus of training was on partnership understanding, right attitude towards the game, discipline, logical approach of mind set. Skill and experience could only be acquired over a long period of time and thus was not my emphasis.

I did not set any specific target for them in terms of position they will end up. My objectives were 1) Team spirit and discipline was to be maintained throughout the tournament; 2) All pairs had improved after the tournament; 3) Cultivate right attitude towards the game amongst players. I would judge the result based on these captioned points.

As expected, the relative skills of all youth team were close, and since for some of the players, this was their first time in a major tournament, it was natural that they could only settle down after a few matches. Nobody was surprised that we positioned 4<sup>th</sup>, but neither were any of the players disheartened.

All three pairs played steadily and determinedly on this round and they were justly rewarded with impressive result. After this round, we were actually leading, though by only a very small margin. Being in the lead was not a good signal, because all of a sudden they had huge pressure our of anticipation and eagerness to win.

Whilst players could still hold their position in their first match against Singapore, the second last day was a disaster. We lost 5:25 to Taipei in the morning and 3:25 against China, so with one more day to play, we were ranking 5<sup>th</sup> and had no practical chance at all to win the championship. I was proud of all my players that despite all these, they managed to sit tight and finished the tournament in style, we won the last two matches and had just sufficient VP (1 VP ahead of Taipei) to come 3<sup>rd</sup>.

I do not intend to give a detail breakdown of individual pair performance vs datum, save to say that all three pairs had made their contribution towards success, at the same time, all six players had made mistakes so that we could not end up winning. However, this was inevitable and I wish they could be more matured and experienced after this tournament. No matter what, earning a berth (for the first time for Hong Kong) to participate in the World Youth Championship is something the Association should be proud of.

I felt we had achieved most of my initial objectives and I would like to congratulate all six players for their commitment and dedication.

Modesty aside, a good captain was absolutely essential for any team, but in particular the youth team. Due to my other responsibilities (as commentator as well as Appeals Committee Deputy Chairman), I regret that I could not devote 100% of my time to the team issue, but I felt I had given them sufficient guidance and encouragement to keep the team morale high throughout.

My recommendation for future youth team selection is: it seems OK that we select by pairs, but proper training is important, and finding a better and more dedicated captain is almost as important, and I wish some of our experienced members can step forth and lead our youth team to a better result in future.

## Captain's Report - Ladies Team for 39<sup>th</sup> PABF Championships Stephen Kwok - NPC HK Ladies Team

I take great pride to report that the Hong Kong Ladies Team secured the last berth to the Venice Cup, to be held in Bermuda from January 7-18, 2000.

In the first round robin, we made our presence felt by leading the field in 3 consecutive rounds up to Match 4, where we had our only major disaster playing against the Australian team. From then on, we maintained the 6<sup>th</sup> position (after trailing Indonesia and China) for almost the entire tournament. This was good enough for our team to earn the right for Zonal Knock Out as both Australia and New Zealand did not belong to Zone 6.

Our first knock out match was pitted against the mighty China Ladies and it seemed that our team did not have high hopes. However, we were only behind by 15 IMPs at half time and I decided to alternate the pairs of Amy - Monica and Ella - Yvonne to sit out so as to concentrate on the anticipated second round knock out. We did lose to China, the winner of the 39<sup>th</sup> PABF Ladies Series, but I must say - no disgrace.

In the second knock out, we played against Chinese Taipei and luck was not on our side in the first 16 boards, where we were behind by 23 IMPs. On the final day, we were cheered up by many other teams and we regained the lead (5 IMPs) in the second session. Our lead was further widened to 21 IMPs at the end of the third session. At the final session, Chinese Taipei struck back and we were exactly tied with 2 boards to go. Our ladies demonstrated their greater calmness and better judgement, and we finally won by 7 IMPs to earn a berth in the Venice Cup.

From the appendix analyzing the results and datum of each pair, it can easily be seen that we had been performing steadily, i.e. breezed past all weaker teams <Korea (9), Thailand (8) and Japan (7)> and did not easily sell out to stronger opponents <China (1), Indonesia (3) and Austrlia (4)>. Our remarkable achievement was to defeat Chinese Taipei (2) in the double round roben and most importantly, in the final match of the Zonal Knock Out. As to our closest competitor, the New Zealand team (5), we scored much better against them but our total VPs were still behind by 16.

Regarding the datum, Amy - Monica's pair scored close to +130 with Ella - Yvonne's pair slightly negative and Fatana - Irene's pair at around -9 per round. The figures might not necessarily represent the actual performance of each pair since there were only 3 other scores for comparison purpose.

Throughout the tournament, all 3 pairs were up to expectation and deserve our most sincere gratitude for making al longing dream come true. Please join me in

congratulating them. May we all wish the Hong Kong Ladies Team another success in the forthcoming Venice Cup.

此牌在 10 桌上 (20 pairs) 有 8 對叫上滿貫，1 對打 5D，一對停於 3NT，8 對中有 4 對因首攻 ♠ 而使滿貫失敗。

獲得這次冠軍的 Levin 和 Weinstein，坐東西方叫上滿貫而對方未攻黑桃，而做成滿貫，難道不是運氣非常好嗎？

獲得第二和第三名的 Miller - Cheek 和 Smith - Billy Cohen 坐南北方，因找到黑桃首攻而得益。

This was played in 10 tables or 20 pairs, of the 10, 8 contracted in slams 1 in 5D and 1 in 3NT. Of the 8 slams, 4 failed due to Spade leads.

The winners Levin - Weinstein, E-W, reached the slam and got no Spade lead. The 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> runners-up, Cheek - Miller and Smith - Cohen, N-Ss, both led Spades against slam contracts and all achieved good results. Perhaps all these pros smelled or recognized some computer dealt patterns here!

East, Alan Sontag, another seasoned pro, surely would have worked out declarer's hand was 3-4-6-0 distribution as a Spade loser in exchange for a Club one would be meaningless had the majors been 4-3 instead. A Club return would give a ruff and discard so Spade would be the only suit to be returned but which? Well Alan played Ace and another, hoping for the best, but the contract was duly made. Had he tried a small Spade exit, there would be no play though!

## Hong Kong Contract bridge Association

### Laws Election

The 1999 PABF Delegates Meeting in Hangzhou passed the following elections to the *Laws of Duplicate Contract Bridge (1997)* for all PABF tournaments:

Law 12C.3 An appeals committee may vary an assigned adjusted score in order to do equity.

Law 18F PABF authorises different methods of making calls (such as bidding boxes, bidding pads).

Law 61B Declarer may ask a defender who has failed to follow suit whether he has a card of the suit led (but a claim of revoke does not automatically warrant inspection of quitted tricks - see Law 66C). Dummy may ask declarer (but see Law 43B2(b)). Defender may ask declarer but not one another.

Law 93B.1 The Chief Director shall hear and rule upon such part of the appeal as deals solely with the Law or regulations. His ruling may be appealed to the committee.

The option to elect differently for local tournaments is delegated by the PABF to member NCBOs. For the purpose of election, the HKCBA adopts the PABF version

### Psychic Bidding

The PABF Delegates resolved that the WBF System Policy on psychic bidding be adopted. A copy of the policy is attached. The PABF delegates also resolved that Psychics that are protected by System and classified as Brown Sticker Conventions are forbidden in PABF tournaments.

The HKCBA adopts a similar stand. Examples of the Brown Sticker Conventions referred to include psychic of strong openings with conventional responses; Psychic non- forcing responses to opening bids of below opening strength, etc.

#### 3.1 Appendix 4. Psychic Bidding (WBF Policy)

Psychic bids are specifically permitted by the Laws of Duplicate Contract Bridge, Provided that any partnership understandings or agreements are disclosed. It would be inconsistent therefore if the WBF forbade psychics in its own tournaments.

Some partnerships of reasonable long standing develop understandings that psychic bids in certain situations will be of a certain type. These are developed partnership understandings and not conventions, and should be explained on the Convention Card and on the Supplementary Sheets. In other words the psychics should be made randomly but any understandings about them should be revealed.

Where partnerships have agreements that psychic bids are expected or are likely in specific situations or where the psychics are protected by System then a convention has developed. Such psychic understandings are classified as Brown Sticker Conventions and are therefore forbidden in certain events. The type of agreement referred to, for example, is where, third in hand at favourable vulnerability, a player is expected to open the bidding on anything at all.
