
On 18 September 2011, US1 competed against US2. We ordinary players have learnt a lot about expert plays from them. For certain distributions, the experts' success rate was higher. However, we could also learn a lesson from a few boards.

First led a  $\blacklozenge$ , Declarer  $\blacklozenge$ A, ruffed a  $\blacklozenge$ , drew trump, North ducked and another trump. North won with  $\spadesuit$  A and played another  $\blacklozenge$  for the 5<sup>th</sup> card. Declarer discarded a  $\clubsuit$  from both his hand and Dummy. We should learn this point. As you watch, you will understand its use. For the 6<sup>th</sup> card, North played another  $\blacklozenge$ , Declare ruffed and drew 2 more rounds of trump. 5 cards remained in each hand. South had to retain 3  $\blacktriangledown$ s and 2  $\clubsuit$ s and so could nor retain a  $\blacklozenge$ . If Declarer ruffed the 5<sup>th</sup> card, South—could still have a  $\blacklozenge$  to exit and North still had 2  $\blacklozenge$ s left! In the end, Declarer lost a  $\clubsuit$  and made his contract.




The bidding of  $3 \spadesuit$  in this room just indicates GF. Similar to fourth suit forcing, there is no direction for the GF. South has not indicated  $6 \heartsuit s$ . Then, the making of  $4 \heartsuit$  requires  $\heartsuit 3 - 3$  and  $\diamondsuit 4 - 2$  with Q. There was no luck. This is a matter of convention.


Against the contract of  $4 \spadesuit$ , East first lead a  $\clubsuit$  to West's A, another  $\clubsuit$ , the  $3^{rd} \clubsuit$  was ruffed. A  $\blacktriangledown$  to hand (West played  $\blacktriangledown$  5), drew 2 rounds of trump, West won with  $\spadesuit$  Q and play another  $\clubsuit$  and Declarer ruffed with  $\spadesuit$ J. The remaining cards were as follows:





Dummy played ♣10, no matter North ruffed or not, Declarer only lost 3 tricks: ♠A, ♠Q and ♣ A. Of course, it was best for South to return a ♥, even a return of ♣ 8 would defeat the contract.

### **Benefit & Consideration**

I think, if you just bid according to HCP disregarding the cards as a whole and failing to re-valuate, you will not be able to bid many suitable contracts. Though you want to benefit from most boards, you need to pay a consideration sometimes.

(1) 我先舉今年 9 月北京國際精英賽的牌例 First of all, I shall use an example from the Beijing International Elite Tournament held in September 2011:



I think, if my teammates hold East's cards, they would pass after 2 as they have only 4 HCP and they would disregard the double made their Partner. Even though 5 cannot be made but it is not easy to defend successfully at the table. You have to lead A and play a low to be ruffed by Partner's A, and then Partner returns a before the contract can be defeated. On the other hand, South would be unwilling to pass 5 with his hand. He required his Partner very little, e.g. Jor 10, 9 and so he bid 5 a. Based on the distribution, even 4 cannot be made. As East was willing to bid 3 with his hand, he can benefit. Since Fantoni played wrongly (very rare), 5 doubled went down 3 and 12 IMP went to the Netherlands.







Afterwards, when East gained entry, he could play another  $\clubsuit$  and West could duck. Then, Declarer could only have 8 tricks  $-2 \clubsuit s$ ,  $2 \spadesuit s$ ,  $3 \blacktriangledown s$  and  $1 \spadesuit$ .

In fact, counting the winner: 4 • s, 4 • s, ruffing 2 • s in the hand, and hoping to win 2 • s, you have to judge who has the • K. If you think East has it, play a • from Dummy for the 3<sup>rd</sup> round (you cannot lose a trump), and then play a small • from hand and East's • K wins. No matter what East returns, you can win 12 tricks. If you guess right, you can make the contract. 



In reality, South returned a and Declarer made his contract. For players who aim to become the World Champion, this is a serious mistake. The situation after the return of a was as follows:

### Slams (by Alan Sze)

Two slams in Team of Six 2011 (session 3) draw my attention.



Opponents landed in 6. Declarer ducked the \*K lead, pull 2 rounds of trumps, ruff the last \*, play • A K (discard a \* in hand) and ruff •, and draw the last trump in the following position:




Dummy discarding the . And East was caught in a simple squeeze.

The squeeze relies on the • entry. Would it be destroyed by switching the • in the 2<sup>nd</sup> trick ??

The answer is NO!!

When the above squeeze cannot be operated, the declarer shall capture the \* switch by \*A, draw 1 round of trump, unblocking \*A, back to hand by another trump, ruff the last \*, and draw 2 more rounds of trumps (discarding a \* in dummy). East has to find a discard in the last 6 cards.



When East discard the ◆, declarer could get ◆ AK, ruff the ◆, back to dummy by ♠K to enjoy the last ◆.

When East discard the ♠, declarer could get the ♠K, ♠ AK and ruff ♠, and score the lovely little ♠ at trick 13.

When your opponents made this 6• in the pivot round (and actually the very first board in the night), you will know that the pretty *Lucky God of Lady* is not on your side.

Anyway, you have to find the lead against 7 • with ♦J 3 •10 9 8 3 2 •3 •K 10 9 8 2



By elimination, \* and trump (\*) were not good choices. The dummy was obviously short in \* and is able to ruff one or two. And you did not know if trump lead would finesse partner's \*Jxxx or not. Your choice would be between the Majors.

I passively led an H, and saw the declarer making the grand slam without difficulties. He played \*A and a ruff, \* to \*A, ruff another \*, unblocking trump A, and get back to hand by \* ruff, pull the trumps and scored the last 3 tricks by \*KQ and \*K.

To make yourself a chance to defeat the grand slam, you have to lead the AJ to ruin the entry of the declarer.

Although the hand was cold under any lead, your \*J would bother the declarer. He could still make the grand slam simply by pulling trumps and finesse your partner's \*Q, and discarding the \* losers on the \* AKQ. Would you believe you opponents leading a true card (J denies higher) when against grand slam?

Let's enjoy the slams!
