
# 亞洲橋牌公開賽的牌例

# Some Examples in Open Series of Asia Bridge Open Congress 2016

今年4月。在北京舉行亞洲橋牌公開賽,公開組有38隊參加,打18輪積分編排賽,我們隊成績不好,錯誤很多,但在我看來,很多錯是可以避免,我這裡舉一些典型牌例,我認為不應該誤解,犯錯的牌。

In April 2016, The Asia Bridge Open Congress was held in Beijing and there were 38 teams in the Open Series. There were 18 rounds for accumulating VPs. The result of our team was not good as we made many mistakes. I consider that some mistakes could have been avoided. I list below some typical examples which I consider that there should not have been misunderstanding or mistakes.

# (1) 第7輪 7<sup>th</sup> Round, Board 13



北開叫 1◆,假定你是東,持上面的牌,叫牌嗎?我想,如果◆10 換成 ◆10,牌型 4414,雖然 11 點,叫加倍就很理想。實際他還是叫 X,第 2家的叫牌,算很積極的叫牌,也許他認為西叫任何花色,他都 PASS, 但橋牌千變萬化,這次西不叫,他不知怎麼辦,實際叫牌:


North opened 1 ♦. If you are East holding the above hand, would you bid? I think, if

♦ 10 was substituted by  $\checkmark$  10, with a shape of 4414, even with 11 HCPs, double is reasonable. In reality, he doubled. In the  $2^{nd}$  seat, his bid was very aggressive. Perhaps, he considered that he would pass any bid made by West. However, there were many unexpected things in bridge. This time West did not bid. East did not how to handle the situation. The actual bids were as follows:

東最後的不叫,犯了不該犯的錯,試想西持什麼牌,可以罰放 1◆? 北的再加倍是求救,現在敌方 1♥到你,是西不能判斷對 1♥能不能懲罰,讓東決定,東是一定要叫牌,叫加倍,牌力不夠,只能叫 1♠,或 1NT,但是他認為自己是低限牌,他第 1 次叫加倍已叫足,所以不叫。或者他可能第一次遇到,不知道西的不叫是逼叫,請看 4 家牌:

East's final pass was a big mistake. East should think about West's hand. Why would West have penalty passed North's 1♦? North's redouble was SOS. South bid 1♥ and it was your turn. Was West unable to judge whether to double 1♥ and so East to decide? East must bid. If he doubled, his strength was not sufficient. East could not bid 1♠ or 1NT. However, East considered that he had a minimum hand and his double in the 1st round was already enough and so he passed. Perhaps, it was the 1st time that he had encountered such a situation. He did not know West's pass was a forcing bid. Please see the 4 hands:





East's pass (East should not pass) caused a loss of 12 IMPs. The East and West at the other table made 4.

(2) 第 14 輪 14<sup>th</sup> Round, Board 2

你是東,持上面牌,開叫 1♣,下家 1♥,同伴 2♥,上家不叫到你。你先分析,同伴沒有叫 1♠,沒有叫加倍,是不是可以考慮同伴沒有 4 張♠,他的 2♥應該有♣支持,扣叫一般都對你的套有支持。那麼,你們的前途是不是在 NT,實際東叫 2♠,沒有意思的叫牌,同伴認為你沒有♥大牌,叫 5♣。如果你叫 2NT, 那麼 3NT 較容易完成,請看 4 家牌

You are East, holding the above hand, opened 1♣, South overcalled 1♥, partner bid
2♥, North passed and it was your turn. You have to analyse 1<sup>st</sup>. Partner has not bid
1♠ nor doubled. You may consider that Partner did not have 4 times ♠, his 2♥
should be showing support in ♣. Usually, cuebid means support for partner's suit. If
so, your prospect should be in NT. In reality, East bid 2♠, a meaningless bid.
Partner considered that you did not have ♥ stopper and bid 5♣. If you have bid 2NT,
3NT should be easily made. Please see the 4 hands:



首引▼K,當你第2墩出♣後(第2墩將1墩▼,第3墩出♣更佳),知道 北有5張♣,因為一般情形你要輸一墩◆,所以你就要猜對北的牌型,把 除♣以外的牌打完,用投入北的方法,才能完成5♣,只有假定北的牌型 是5332,如果是其他牌型,恐怕你也很難打出消去投入。所以你先要猜 北哪一套花色有3張,其實南叫過1♥,不大會有7張,你要猜錯,當然 打不成,所以先將2輪♥,成功後再用◆Q飛,雙飛◆多數會失敗,因為 你沒有◆8,如果◆Q得到,再◆A,見◆K沒有掉下,只有假定北的牌是 2335 牌型,才能打成。如果◆K在南家,根本打不成。實戰中他打雙飛 ◆而失敗(不會成功的雙飛)。輸 11IMP。

First lead ♥K. When you played a ♣ at trick 2 (it is better to ruff a ♥ at trick 2 1<sup>st</sup> and play a \* at trick 3), you knew that North had 5 times \*, As it is normal for you to lose a ♦, so you must guess North's shape correctly. You have to eliminate the other suits except \*, and throw in North in order to make 5\*. You can assume that North's shape to be 5332. For other shape, you cannot use elimination and thrown in to make the contract. So, you need to guess which other suit North would have 3 cards. South has bid 1, and unlikely that he has 7 times Hs. If your guess is wrong, the contract can of course go down. So. you should ruff 2 rounds of  $\lor$  1<sup>st</sup>. If it is successful, you can use  $\lor$  Q to finesse. Double finesse of ♦ will likely fail. The reason is that you do not have ♦8. ♦ Q wins, play ♦ A. If ♦ K does not drop, you have to assume that North's hand to be 2335 before you can make the contact. If ◆ K is with South, the contract cannot be made. In practice, he double finessed ♦ but failed (the double finesse will not succeed) and lost 11 IMPs.



第 5 墩出 ♣就很不完美,是的,飛到♣,就有 3 墩♣, 3 墩◆ , 2 墩♠,還要送出♥,才有 1 墩♥,但總要考慮飛不到時的情形,除非你認為,飛不到♣就一定打不成。事實又不是這樣。第 5 墩一定要出♥,這不影響飛到♣的情形,因為你一定要送出一墩♥,才有第 9 墩,反而飛不到♣時,只要♥A 對位,多一條成功的機會。請看 4 家牌:

To play is a ♣ at trick 5 is not perfect. Yes, if you can finesse ♣, successfully, you can win 3 tricks in ♣, 3 tricks in ♦, and 2 tricks in ♠. You still need to give a ♥ in order to have 1 ♥ trick. You still need to consider what will happen if the finesse is unsuccessful. You may consider that you cannot make

the contact unless you can finesse  $\clubsuit$  successfully first. However, it is not true. If you give a  $\blacktriangledown$  at trick 5, this will not affect your later finesse of  $\clubsuit$ , because you must give a  $\blacktriangledown$ , in order to have the 9<sup>th</sup> trick. Conversely, if the finesse of  $\clubsuit$  is not successful, you have an additional chance to make 3NT is  $\blacktriangledown$ A is on side and you have an additional chance. Please see the 4 hands:


In practice, South played a \* at trick 5 and the finesse was unsuccessful. The defender forced out A and 3NT could no longer be made.

# (4) 猜牌也要講運氣 Guessing also needs luck

第9輪 9<sup>th</sup> round, Board 13

面對排名最後的隊,也只能小勝,因為這副牌,輸 17IMP。

Facing the team with the lowest ranking, our team could only have a small win because we lost 17 IMPs for this board.



## 二桌都由東打 6♥或 6NT。

The East's at both 2 tables declared 6♥ or 6NT.


隊友在處理♥時,先♥A,再♥,北 ♥6,莊家放錯而下一。在我這桌,莊家先出♥Q,輸給北♥K,下一輪♥A,打下我的雙張♥J而打成。仔细想想,他的出牌也有道理。如果只考慮南北♥是 2-3 分佈,那麼南的♥: 持 Kx, Jx, KJ, xxx, Kxx, KJx 都能打成。只有南持 xx, Jxx 才打不成。打成的機會很大。

When our East dealt with ♥, he 1<sup>st</sup> played ♥A, then another ♥, North ♥6, Declarer let go and down one. At my table, declarer played ♥Q 1st, lost to North's ▼K; and then he played ♥A to knock out my ♥J out of my doubleton and he made the contract. His play was reasonable. If the ♥ in North are 2-3 分佈, the contract will be made if South's ♥s are: Kx, Jx, KJ, xxx, Kxx, KJx. Only when South holds

xx or Jxx that the contract will not be made. So, the chance of making is quite big.

# (5) 第 17 輪 17<sup>th</sup> round, Board 13

二桌都由南主打 4▲, 我坐南, 首攻◆, 讓你看 4 家牌, 恐怕也難打成。隊 友讓敵方打成 4▲, 可能嗎?相信只有睡着了才行, 輸 15IMP.

The North's at both two tables declared 4♠, I sat South. First lead a ♠. Even if I let you see the 4 hands, it is difficult for you to make the contract. Teammates let opponents make 4♠, Was it possible? I believe it would only be possible if someone had fallen asleep. We lost 15 IMPs.


# Zia at USBC

In May 2016, I watched the play of Zia at USBC 2016. As his partner and teammates did not perform well, his team only stayed among the top 8 in the final. You will understand when you read the examples below:





Who did you finesse? Even if South has all the 3 remaining ♣, if North and South's ♦s are 4-2 or 3-3, you can still make 5♣. If ♣s are 2-1, your 5♣ is cold.

The finesse failed. North returned a ◆ and played another ◆. 5♣ down 1. Please see the 4 hands:



First lead ▲10, a friendly attack to you. However, you should not play 3 rounds of ♠s immediately to discard the ♥ loser because North has previously bid 1♠ and your 3<sup>rd</sup> ♠ ☐ may be ruffed by South. So, you must handle the trump suit 1<sup>st</sup>. You play the ♣Q and South ♣4. Should you play ♣A from Dummy? Let us analyse first.

Your plan will only fail if North holds ♣Kx. (The reason is that South has another ♣, which he can use to ruff your 3<sup>rd</sup> ♠ when you attempt to discard the ♥ loser, and you have to lose to ♣K at the end). If South has ♣K, your finesse will of course succeed. However, if South holds singleton ♣K or ♣Kx, your placing of ♣A can succeed. In addition, North and South have 9 HCPs in total. Who is more likely having the ♣K? I don't think you would regard South having ♣K more. In practice, East played ♣Q from hand and played small in dummy and failed to make the contract. Why did Zia's partner only know to finesse? Please see the 4 hands:







So, they placed •4 to let Declarer guess. However, no one guessed wrongly and all Declarers won 10 tricks without difficulty.

## Are You Up to The Task?

The Interport Trial has always been a popular event and this year is no exception – a staggering number of fifteen teams have registered, perhaps due to the fact that it is Hong Kong's turn to host the tournament, a few days before the Inter-city carnival.

The competing teams are to play a complete round robin with eight boards per round. Your team suffers a mediocre start and this is the fifth session. Earlier in the set, your side gained two substantial swings – firstly, you stole a razor-thin 3NT vulnerable when opponents could cash five tricks off the top and, on the subsequent board, right-sided a vulnerable 3NT, although you cannot be absolutely sure of the gains at this point. You need to do well in this crucial board to protect the sizeable lead.

Board 3, S/EW - you hold as West this ensemble:

- **♠** A
- **♥** J105
- ♦ AQ97
- ♣ QJ753

South (RHO) opens 1NT first in hand, promising 12-14 hcps and you choose to double, showing 14+ hcps. North (LHO) passes, which forces opener to redouble. Partner passes nonchalantly and South goes into the think tank. Eventually he emerges with a bid of 2♥, ostensibly 5 cards, taking your side off the hook for the time being. LHO then comes to life and leaps to 4♥, ending the auction. *What would you lead?* 

\*

Don't tell me you select the ♠A. Partner rates to be entry-less so it will be futile to look for a ruff.

An argument can be made for a club lead but, not knowing dummy's shape, this is potentially dangerous. You opt for a relatively safe ♥5.

Dummy puts down:

- **♦** J10954
- ♥AQ2
- **♦** 865
- ♣ A4

That is a bit thin,  $n'est\ pas$ ? The contract should be touch and go. In other words, you need to be alert and on your toes.

Declarer lets this run to his ♥9, then plays another trump to dummy, and passes the jack of spades. You take the ♠A perforce. The moment of truth has arrived... *How do you exit?* 

\*

Let's try to construct declarer's hand. The fact that he does not attempt to ruff a club in dummy means he also has two clubs. In all likelihood, he is 3=5=3=2.

In terms of high card points, he should have something like:

- **♦** KXX
- **♥** KXXXX
- ♦ KXX
- **♣** KX

It looks automatic to exit with a third round of trumps. Are there any perils?

\*

The danger is that declarer may also hold the jack or ten of diamonds. If you play the third trump, declarer can finesse spades, then a spade to the king and cash two rounds of trumps.

In the five card ending, if you keep two clubs and three diamonds, declarer can eliminate clubs and play a diamond to his 'presumed' ten or jack for an end-play (since you are marked with the ace queen of diamonds).

If, however, you keep three clubs and two diamonds, declarer can play small diamonds from hand twice to establish the game-going trick in diamonds.

So, what is the remedy?

\*

The answer is simple – at trick four, instead of a trump, you exit with a club. That way, you are one step ahead of declarer and in the end game, you can keep the ace, queen of diamonds and one club more than declarer.

The full hand is:

- **♦** J10954
- ♥AQ2
- **♦** 865
- **♣** A4

- Α
- **♥** J105
- **♦** AQ97
- **♣** QJ753

- **♦** Q832
- **¥** 43
- **♦** J42
- **♣** 10962
- **♦** K76
- **♥** K9876
- **♦** K103
- **♣** K8

At the other table, South opens 1♥, West overcalls 2♣, North doubles, South rebids 2NT and North, instead of bidding 3NT (which turns out to be cold as the cards lie), uncharacteristically bids 3♥, ending the auction. The play is uneventful - declarer takes 9 tricks safely and secretly congratulates the partnership for a well-judged stop.

Thus, if you defeat the ambitious 4♥, you gain 5 imps, but if you let the contract slip through, you lose 7 imps instead.

Honestly, how well did you fare?
