

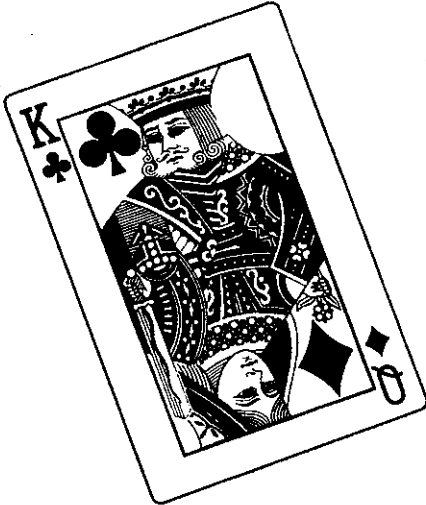

 - c. Cyberwall HK SAR Inter-city Bridge Championships 2000
SB has signed the contract with Hotel Miramar and the details will be reported during the intercity organization committee meeting.
 - d. The physical check of equipment can't be started until the end of May, as TB are not available now and may need the assist of member to check the bidding box.

PP has made an agreement with Irene Ho that the association will purchase all 4000 decks of card within this 2 years.

4. WBF re-zoning
AC explained the WBF's rezoning plan, merging zone 4's/ Asian and middle East NCBO's with zone 6 and moving Singapore, Malaysia and Indonesia to Zone 7.
Based on the financial burden that would have placed on us and the uneven proportion of budge population vs NCBO's. The delegate was instructed to vote as such in the PABF delegates meeting.
5. Convention card Procedures
Effective from 1st June, all member must have convention cards during every tournament and the new convention card regulations will be effective. This will be posted on the web and also distributed during the Tournaments.
6. HKCBA web site virtual hosting and management of e-mail addresses.
HKCBA web site will use web site virtual hosting within the budget. DC will check and confirm the cost spent per month, and management of e-mail addresses. DC
7. HKCBA Budget
HKCBA Budget will be reported during the next meeting.
8. A.O.B
 - a. A complaint letter from a player who have joined the tournament organized by JSBA. JSBA is not affiliated to HKCBA. AC will reply to JSBA about the matter. AC
SB suggested the bridge club of HK universities should have a link with HKCBA and aid them when they held tournament. DC will arrange this issue. DC
 - b. SB suggests once the playing team has won the trial and withdrawal without sufficient reasons, a penalty will be received that is prohibited to represent HK for 1 Year.
The council members suggested to defer such decision., seeking opinions from the members.
 - c. DC reported that Cheung Lik's team apologize for the withdrawal of participating in the PABC 2000 and will write an apology letter.
 - d. Bob's column in SCMP will be discontinued at the end of April. It is suggested that AC writes a letter to the editor hoping that some local bridge contents be available in the SCMP, especially for the benefits of the youth. AC
 - e. SB reported that the Youth Development Council wants to have a web link with us and this issue is accepted.

第五屆世界頂尖個人橋牌賽

5th Generali World Masters

第5屆 Generali World Masters 在今年4月13到15日於希臘首都雅典舉行，像以往一樣，在有52人參加的男子組冠軍是意大利的 Antonio Sementa。成績為57.15。中國的楊立新 (Li Xin Yang) 以50.98 取得第18名。

有28位女士參加的女子組冠軍被法國的 Benedicte Cronier 奪得，成績是55.25。中國的孫茗以50.93的成績取得第12名。今年還增加了青年組比賽，參加者共20名，香港隊的 Kit Lai 以53.62較好的成績並列第3。

我們先來看 Sementa 失意的一副牌，南北方以3-3 王牌打2H，防守方要幫幾次忙，才能讓南打成(?) 也許南的叫牌使東無法準確算出南的牌型。但無論如何，這副牌東西的防守不能再差了，南能完成被加倍的2H還是有運氣吧!

This year's event was held from 13-15 April in Athens, Greece, as in the past 52 individual World Masters were invited, in the men's competition.

The champion was Italy's Antonio Sementa, 57.15%. China's Yang Lixin was 18th 50.98%. 28 ladies were in the women's, French Benedicte Cronier came 1st, 55.25%. China's Sun Ming was 12th, 50.93%. For the youth, there were 20 participants, Hong Kong Dicky Lai wai-kit was joint 3rd, 53.62%.

Let start with a bad hand for Sementa, N-S played in a 3-3 fit 2H(Dbl), flat hands, the defence had to help a lot to make it come true, possibly the hidding got East Sementa all tangled up, anyway, this was what happened.

10. 明手出最後一張♥, 東上♥A, 這樣最後還要給莊家一墩♣.
Dummy now played the last Heart taken by East's A and eventually had to give a Club trick to declarer, his 8th.

莊家一共贏得2墩♠, 2墩♥(其中一墩將吃♠)一墩♦, 3墩♣, 這樣的防守你信嗎?坐東的是 Sementa (這次的冠軍) 莊家是大名鼎鼎的挪威選手 Helgemo

Altogether it was 2 Spades, 2 Hearts (Spade ruff actually), 1 Diamond and 3 Clubs. Declarer was the formicable Viking, Helgemo.

首攻♥2, 莊家將吃, 如這時先調一輪將, 已可完成定約. 但他先出♦9, 西出小, 明手墊♣, 被東將吃, 東出♥K, 莊家用小將吃, 被西超將吃, 一張♣到東, 再出♥, 提升將牌K而下一.

H2 was led, ruffed by declarer, had he drew 1 round of trump, he could have made the contract. Anyway, he tried D9, small from West, dummy discard Club and East ruffed and shot back Ha, declarer ruffed small, West over, then a Club to West's Ace and another Heart for the perfect defence and uppercut.

SQ was led, declarer won A, C4 to dummy and Club back to J, Gawrus, frp, [artner's signal, knew declarer had only 2 Spades and 2 Clubs. So he took CA, cashed SK and exited with Diamond, Holding declarer to 9 tricks only and 4 out maximum 24 match-points.

22 points and both 4-3-3-3s, a nightmare for 3NT? Well, West led CA, East discouraged with the 2, a switch now to Spade or Diamond would have killed the contract but she played CK and CJ next. Declarer now played SA and Spade ducked to West's K who was endplayed as Heart or Diamond exit would yield the 9th trick to declarer.

East led the ♣Q, and declarer won, discarding a spade, and cashed ♦Q. If he now cashes ♠A and then takes the top diamonds to discard a spade from dummy, he can cross ruff his way to thirteen tricks, but he slightly mistimed things by cashing the diamonds first so he now got 12 tricks +980.

To Bid or Not To Bid (Version Q)

David CC Ng

I have come across several interesting bidding considerations during the IMP tournament held on 13 April 1999 by HKCBA. In fact, this article has been written up immediately after the tournament. Nevertheless, I intend to hold up for two reasons. One is to wait until you guys forget the hands so that you can consider the problems in a neutral manner. The other is to wait until my partner leaving Hong Kong. Those hand are presented in the format of bidding problems which are as follows:-

Hand 1 Board 20 [Both Vul; West Dealer; IMP scoring]

West	North	East	South

As South, what will you bid after 3 passes ?

Your Hand is ♠Q54 ♥K ♦KQJ1073 ♣Q83

Hand 2 Board 19 [EW Vul; South Dealer; IMP Scoring]

As North, what will you bid in the third position at favorable vulnerability?

Your Hand is ♠KQ7 ♥AK32 ♦10872 ♣103

Hand 3 Board 4 [BOTH Vul; West Dealer; IMP Scoring]

As North, what will you respond?

Your Hand is ♠KQ6 ♥32 ♦8732 ♣1032

Regarding Hand (3), assume you and your partner adopt Acoll system, i.e.

- i. Weak Notrump (12-14 HCP)
- ii. Acoll 2♦ (8+ playing tricks with ♦ as trumps)
- iii. Partner's bid of 1♦ guarantees 4+card ♦

Suggested Answers To Bidding Problems

In fact, there appears to have no perfect or standard solutions to the 3 problems presented. The purpose of this article is to share my personal bidding style with you guys and discuss the concepts behind the recommended bids.

Let's us start with Hand 1 which is reproduced for your easy reference:-

Problem 1 (1/3)

Hand 1 Board 20 [Both Vul; West Dealer; IMP scoring]

West	North	East	South
Pass	Pass	Pass	?

As South, what will you bid after 3 passes ?

The following are 5 possible bids for your consideration and the reasons behind:-

- (1) Pass. (no Ace and opponents are likely to hold Majors)
- (2) 1♦ (standard opening with 13 HCP and a good 6 card suit)
- (3) 2♦ (weak 6+card * ; at least 1 participant did choose this bid at the table)
- (4) 3♦ (attempt to buy the hand and shut out opponent's majors)
- (5) 1NT (Controlled Psychic ; try to buy the hand as cheap as possible)

Choice (1) to (4) has individual merits and downsides. My personal preference is 1NT.

Would you try to perceive what the bidding development will be after 1NT opening ?

Problem 1/(cont.2/3)

At the fourth position after 3 passes (both Vul), South opens 1NT North's likely responses are :-

- (a) Pass [1NT is likely be made as North bound to have 5+HCP]
- (b) 2♣ - Stayman [South rebids 2♦, if North rebids 2♥, South rebids 2♠; If North rebids 2NT/3NT, South passes]
- (c) 2♦ - Transfer 2♥ [South passes-happily]
- (d) 2♥- Transfer 2♠ [South accepts the transfer-happily. If North continues, simply prefers 3♠ or 4♠ as cheap as possible]
- (e) 3♣ - Preempt/Invite [South passes-happily]
- (f) 2♠/2NT -Transfer 3♣ [South accept the transfer -happily]
- (g) 3♦/♥/♠ - Invite [South passes-happily with ♦&♠, not so with ♥]
- (h) 3♦ - Transfer 3♥ [South passes- happily]
- (i) 3♥ - Transfer 3♠ [South accepts the transfer-happily]
- (j) 2NT/3NT [South passes or sign-off by bidding 3♦/4♦]
- (k) 4♦/♥ -Transfer 4♥/♠ [Unlikely as North fails to open weak 2 Majors]

From the above-listed responses, you can estimate the Loss vs Gain ratio for opening 1NT.

As a matter of fact, your partner (North) holds the following hand:-

North's Hand is ♠854 ♥A652 ♦A62 ♣K754

The reality is that North jump to 3NT after Stayman. The result is 3NT

-1 down undoubled

Facing the proper defence :- First Lead ♠ and ♠ return (-50 points). Yet it is North /South who have a happy ending because the average is 3♥ / 3♠ both made with +140 points for East/West.

You are cold for 2NT/ 3♦ with opponents cold for 3♥ / ♠ . However, 1NT has pre-empted the opponent from overcalling 1♠ . Bidding 1NT at such position is considered strategically superior because you are likely to gain at 8 out of 11 situations when partner's responses are predicted . [(a)-(k)]

Problem 1/(cont./3/3)

You may loss only if he jumps to 3NT. Even so, you are unlikely to be doubled by opponents also both of them are passed-hands.

Alternatively, your gain is substantial as opponents are deprived of the opportunity to locate their major fit. Since neither opponents has bid in first or third position indicating that they are unlikely to hold 6+card good major. Therefore, they are unlikely to overcall at 2 -Level with a passed hand partner and being vulnerable after your strong 1NT bid.

Conclusion

Recommended Bid :1NT

1NT is the bid recommended because it is a strategic bid at such a strategic position

- i. It gains in most cases. [see (a) - (k)]
- ii. Its loss is minimal because of the safety net [passed-hand opponents are unlikely to Double]

If judged by result, Pass is the winning bid for this board.

Additional Remarks

For those adopt weak no-trump opening, the bid of 1NT in such a position is almost 'mandatory' since partner is extremely unlikely to hamper your 'brilliant' bid by jumping to 3NT/4♥/4♠.

Let's us proceed to Hand 2 which is reproduced for your easy reference:-

Problem 2 (1/2)

As North, what will you bid in the third position at favorable vulnerability'?

Your Hand is ♠K107 ♥AK32 ♦10872 ♣103

The likely responses are :

- (1) Pass [Natural, what else? Flat hand with only 10 HCP]
- (2) 1♥ [Light opening]
- (3) 1♠ [Semi-Psychic]
- (4) 1♦ [Light opening ; especially if the system adopted being 5 card Major]

Choice (3) is virtually out because the consequence for psychic 1♠ with this hand losses more than gain in the long run. [Nevertheless, there are merits for this bid. Those who are interested can just think along the line as what will be the likely responses from partner and /or opponents, then you may find the merits for this bid]

Here what I tend to discuss is the merits for opening 1♥ at such strategic position [third hand with favorable vulnerability] against its downsides.

The upside of bidding 1♥ being:-

- (i) Lead directing.
- (ii) Baring your opponent from reaching the optimum contract of 3NT in case ♥QJ are not in the hand of one opponent.
- (iii) Pre-emptive effect. e.g. The fourth hand is deprived of bidding minors at 1-Level and then jump to 2NT to show a strong balance hand.
- (iv) Out-bid your opponent entirely especially if they holds minor fit and you have major fit or under some circumstances, even if they have ♠ fit.

The downside of bidding 1♥ being that NS will occasionally suffer a loss of -300 points (=7 IMP) if doubled by opponents provided that EW has no 3NT contract and partner has no 5 card suit for escape. Nevertheless, the chance for opponent to double for penalty is very rare.

Problem 2 (2/2)

Further discussion in respect of (iv) : outbid your opponent entirely ----

Let us review the following bidding sequence:-

West	North	East	South

EW being vulnerable, it will be too venturesome for East to balance at that position, especially at IMP scoring. South may raise to 2♥ with only 3 card ♥ support. (Law of Total Tricks may not apply here). Besides, NS will be virtually immunized against opponent's penalty-double even if East holds a trump stack. His only choice is to pass quietly and sets your contract. Your

price is only -50 points for each under-tricks. Cheap !

Conclusion

Recommended Bid : 1♥.

Bidding 1♥ at 3rd position is a strategic bid no matter what kind of system you adopt. It gains more than it loses. It is even more tempting for me to open 1♥ at Match-point (Pairs) events because the gain is more substantial in the following two areas:-

- (1) Lead-Directing : Save up-tricks is extreme essential in pairs game.
- (2) Pre-emptive : Outbid the opponent in minors.

South can readily raise 1♥ to 2♥ even with 3 card support only. Such simple response will be virtually immunized from opponent's penalty-double. Besides, there is no need to pre-empt 3♥ with only 4 card ♥ support (Assume you adopt pre-emptive raise. You are likely to buy the contract at 2-Level.)

Additional Remarks

Some experts advocate the concept of Pre-Balance by West immediately after the bid of 2♥ by South as a remedy.

Recommendation : Adopt Reverse Drury or Drury or Two-way Drury so as to differentiate the major raise in case South has a maximum pass hand with 3+card ♥ fit.

Let's us proceed to Hand 3 which is reproduced for your easy reference:-

Problem 3 (1/3)

Regarding Hand 3, assume you and your partner adopt Acoll system, i.e.

- a. Weak Notrump (12-14 HCP)
- b. Acoll 2♦ (8+ playing tricks with ♦ as trumps)
- c. Partner's bid of 1♦ guarantees 4+card ♦

The likely responses are :

- (1) Pass [Obligated to Bid? Flat with only 5 HCP and 1 distribution point]
- (2) 2♦ [Single raise ; have pre-emptive effect]
- (3) 3♦ [Pre-emptive raise ; book bid ? !! Reference : Tournament

Acol]

Please re-visit the bidding sequences indicated above. Note that both opponents are passed-hand.

Q.1 How many HCP is expected from partner ?

A.1 At least 15 HCP, more likely to be within the range 15-19(20) HCP.

Q.2 Assume your partner holds a balance hand, what is HCP ?

A.2 15-19 HCP since NS adopts Weak Notrump opening (12-14HCP)

Q.3 Will NS miss a game if North choose to pass ?

A.3 Very unlikely as South has denied 8+playing tricks by failing to open Acol 2♦. 5♦ is virtually out and 3NT is very remote.

Problem 3 (2/3)

Q.4 What is the purpose of Pre-emptive Bid ?

A.4 Robbing opponent's bidding space; preventing them from exchange information constructively so as to reduce their chance from reaching the optimum contract. There is no point to pre-empt if you can foresee that the opponents are unlikely to enter the bidding or your side holds the balance of strength.

After the above 4 Q & A, you can guess that my preferred answer is **PASS** by North.

My arguments for bidding **PASS** are:-

- (1) NS should hold the balance of strength. No need to pre-empt.
- (2) No game prospect. Bidding 2♦ just generates false hope for game.
- (3) Bidding 3♦ to pre-empts partner? not the passed-hand opponents.
- (4) Both opponents have passed. They are unlikely to hold 6+card suit in Major. Even if they do, it is unlikely for them to compete to 3-Level.

The slight downside of **PASS** are that in case either opponent possesses (55)+majors but with strength less than an opening hand, they can enter the auction by cue-bidding 2♦. Given that they can locate 9 card fit in major, they can compete up to 3-Level and NS has to buy the contract at 4-Level.

Besides, there is a slight chance of missing a remote 3NT.

The advantages of single-raise to 2♦ are that it prevents opponent from Cue-bidding in case they have (55)+ Majors and can reach a remote 3NT.

Its drawbacks are that partner assumes 6-9 HCP from you and may bid 2NT/3NT with no chance at all. Else, he may attempt to explore game in ♦.

The advantages of pre-emptive raise to 3♦ being that you secure your contract immediately. The passed-hand opponents are guaranteed to be shut out. The drawbacks are that such pre-emptive bid is not protected by the Law of Total Tricks as partner may possess 4 card ♦ only. Occasionally, West may hold a trump stack behind South and NS, being vulnerable, may suffer much if East balances with a take-out double and West passes for penalty. Besides, NS may play better in a 1NT /2NT contract.

Problem 3 (3/3)

Conclusion : Recommended Bid : Pass

Additional Remarks:-

1. I prefer to pre-empt 3♦ with ♦KQxxxx or even ♦KJxxxx to cater for 3NT but not Hand (3). At least such bid is protected by the Law of Total Tricks.
2. Playing Acol, North is safe to pass as partner fails to open Acol 2♦
On the contrary, North is obliged to respond if NS adopts Natural (4/5 card Major) because there is still game prospect.
3. One has to be familiar with the ramifications of the whole system before he can manipulate it.

Afterword

The above 3 examples illustrate bidding **CONCEPTS**, *NOT* bidding systems or conventions.

During the past 2 decades, I had read over 300 bridge books and magazines which cover virtually all bidding systems, conventions and specific bidding devices (e.g. Spiral Scan).

Familiar with all kinds of bidding systems and conventions, it seems that I was armed with a powerful machine gun with hundreds of bullets. However, I failed to find the trigger of the machine gun. As a result, Power Precision System, once deployed by David CC Ng, becomes Powder Precision.

Years ago, I have an opportunity to attend a bridge seminar conducted by Mr. Samuel Wan. That seminar focuses on a specific topic i.e. Pre-emptive Bidding. Sam talks about bidding concepts (Not system or convention). The bid differs at different positions and varies according to different vulnerabilities (NV vs. NV; Vul vs. Vul; Vul vs. Non-Vul; Non-Vul vs. Vul)

Thank You, Sam (hopes that he reads this article). Ultimately, I find the trigger of the bidding machine gun. i.e. the right concept. Now I have to overcome the hurdle- Learn how to pull the trigger.

And then Rosenberg trying a Club (ruff?) instead of a forcing Diamond, despite counting out declarer's hand having insufficient points. Well, all in all, that was Vanderbilt 2000. The other room stopped in a 'scientific' game only.

PABF CONGRESS 2000

今年5月下旬在印尼舉行第4屆PABF Congress，香港未派隊參加。只參加對式賽。香港Lawrence Lau - Patrick Choi獲東西組的第8名，進入PABF決賽。參加公開組隊式賽的22隊，其中印尼有14隊參加，日本3隊，其它新加坡，澳門，泰國，台北，中國湖北各一隊參加。女子組有7隊，青年組10隊，比賽結果印尼隊獲得這三個組的第一名，公開組第一名的印尼隊包括Lasut，Manoppo，Sacul在內的國家隊。第二名是日本國家隊。下面是印尼和日本隊決賽的部份牌例：

At the end of this May, Indonesia hosted the 4th PABF congress. H.K. did not have any team participating though Lawrence Lau -Patrick Choy played and came 8th in the EW direction and got into the Pairs Final.

There were 22 teams in the Open Series, 14 from Indonesia, 3 from Japan and 1 each from Singapore, Macau, Thailand, Taipei and Hubei, China. In the women's, 7 teams took part and 10 entered the Youth. The Indonesian teams won all 3 titles. In the Open competition, the Champion Team consisted of the perennials Lasut, Manoppo, Sacul, 2nd were the Japan National Team, here are some hands from the finals between these teams.

Both Souths were declaring 3NT.

Against Japan, Indonesia led H8, to 10, J and K. Declarer then played Spades with West winning the 3rd round with Ace and exited in C3, declarer could take only 8 tricks from here.

Against Indonesia, Japan attacked with CQ lead, declarer replied with 2 more rounds of the suit. West won the 3rd round, switched to H8, 10, J and K. Declarer now played on Spades, 8 to dummy's K and a small one to hand's J. West won Ace, cashed erroneously his good Club, enabling declarer to have 3 Clubs, 3 Spades, 1 Heart and 2 Diamonds. He should have know that, had declarer DK and the Q, he would have 9 tricks already, so, once coming in with SA, he should have attacked Diamonds and when in again with Clubs, attack the same suit again, cutting off the communications and reducing declarer to either 2 Spades and 3 Clubs or 3 Spades and 2 Clubs but not 3 in both.

Facts: Screen was used. The director was called after the play was completed. N alerted E that 2♦ is a transfer to♥. S did not alert W. E claimed misinformation and said if 2♦ was natural he would bid 4♠. The director ruled that 4♠ made. NS appealed. The Chief TD overruled the director based on incorrect timing of E's summoning the director. He should have call after the auction as he knew there was an irregularity. Also the Chief TD has inspected the NS convention card that they played system ON after NT overcalls, therefore it was a misbid by S rather than misinformation by N.

Law References: Laws 9B1a, 9B2 and 11A.

Supplementary statement by players: South's 1NT overcall after double and redouble should not be the same as normal 1NT overcall as stated by N which is same as the one in their convention card. Therefore N's explanation of 2♦ is a misinformation provided to E. Under this condition E will bid 4♠ directly when the screen is not used that 2♦ is not a transfer. E has not summoned the director when the auction is finished because this will convey information to W that 2♦ by N is a transfer. The line of defense of the board will be different. Therefore director is summoned when the play of board is ended.

Appeal Committee Decision: It is unanimous decision of the Appeals Committee that the damage of this hand was caused solely by EW's failure to take action over the 2♦ bid and the error in defending the hand. This took into account that the 2♦ bid may or may not be a transfer, as this auction is unlikely to be covered in the convention card. The committee unanimous decided that the director's ruling, i.e. 2♦ by N -1, should stand. Deposit to be returned.
