2002 年世界橋牌錦標賽 2002 World Bridge Championship

2002年8月17--31日在加拿大蒙特利爾舉行了世界橋牌錦標賽，香港隊有兩隊參加 Open Team (即 Power Rosenblum Cup)；有兩對選手參加 Open Pairs，一對進入決賽；有四對選手參加 Mixed Pairs，二對進入決賽。參加 IMP 的楊氏父子，在 130 對選手中名列 17。

在 Mixed Pairs 比賽中，我和 Ella 為伴，沒想到在 434 對選手中，我們以平均分 51.97% 第 144 名進入決賽 (進入決賽的共有 182 對選手)。雖然最後的名次不理想，但我已經很滿意了。有些牌值得回憶。

首先在預賽中，遇到大名鼎鼎的 Zia Mahmood，(他的同伴是 Radin) 遇到下面這副牌：

This was held in Montreal, Canada, 17-31 August, 2002. HK had 2 teams in the Open Team, the Power Rosenblum Cup; 2 pairs in the Open Pairs, one qualified for the Finals; 4 Pairs in Mixed Pairs with 2 entering the finals and, in the IMP Pairs, the Leong father and son finished 17th out of 130.

In the mixed Pairs, Ella and I unexpectedly qualified: 51.97% or 144th out of 434 pairs (182 pairs in the Finals). Our final results was not ideal but overall it was a satisfying experience. Here are some of the boards:

我坐西，Zia 坐北開叫 2C，南應 2D (Waiting)，我叫 2S，好像沒有人拿我這牌叫牌，Zia 想了很久，也許他認為我這無“名氣”的人到他這兒班門弄斧來了，我拿 AKQ105，你叫 2S？叫牌進程如下：

I was West, Zia opened 2C, Radin 2D, waiting, I bid 2S perhaps the only player to do so; Zia thought long and the bidding proceeded as:

Zia doubled, my plan in fact was to bid 2NT if Radin passed and ended up possibly in 3C(x), -800 against good defence, and better against lesser ones. In the end, we had average on the board and could be better without the double, my guess is they wouldn't bid the grand slam like some other pairs, say, Meltzer:

南開叫 1D，我超叫 1S，之後北叫到 3NT。首攻 ♠K，再出 ♠，第 3 墩 ♠時東墊♥3。第四副莊家出♦6，東出♦3，這是一決定時刻，如用♦10 飛連拔 4 張♦，西被擠住，有的桌上，西墊成單張♥K，被莊家用♥A 打下，♣A 回手，再飛東♥J，超一完成得頂分。如想得平均分，只有墊去一張♠，之後無論莊家用♣或♥投入，都可得到第 9 墩。我們算運氣莊家只拔♦AKQ，想打♦3-3，或 2 張♦帶 J，但事與願違，不得不以一下而告終。

South opened 1D, I overcalled 1S and NS reached 3NT. Ella led SK then S5 and discarded H3 on the 3rd Spade. In the 4th trick declarer played D6, this was decisive, had the 10 been finessed, West would be squeezed, to the lone Heart King as in some tables, and dropped under the Ace with the subsequent show-up finesse against partner's Jack and a cold bottom. To get average, West had to discard a winning Spade holding declarer to 9 tricks on a Club or Heart throw-in. At the table, we were lucky when South simply played the honors and had to go 1 down, 4 Spades and 1 Heart or Club.

This was an amazingly rare faulty Indonesian declarer play. Both Norths declared in 3NT with same H2 lead, 8, 10 and Ace. Manoppo then let SJ ride, followed by SA, Diamond Ace back to hand and SK and no luck, 1 down, too tired maybe. The Italians played Heart Ace, Spade Ace and Spade finesse, when a Heart came back, the Queen of course was played for 4 Spades, 2 Hearts, 2 Diamonds and 1 Club.

If a Diamond was led, declarer would have no chance, here, H8 in response to partner's call was in perfect order. East returned another Heart with dummy discarding a Diamond. Declarer now played a Diamond to Jack and Queen and East somehow thought it wise to persist with a 3rd Heart, Q,

West ruffed S4 and dummy overruffed to play Club K, A and ruffed. Next came HJ, West ruffed SK while dummy let go DK, enabling now the 3 losers to evaporate, 2 ruffed and 1 on CQ. Well, what a relief for mortal defenders like us when champions played like that. 4S in the other room failed by 1 on a friendly CJ lead, 12 IMPs.

South's hand was almost worthless after West's strong Club, all honors on the wrong side and so must be glad to support partner and merrier when allowed to play when 6S was easily on and 7S also cold on the cards: The defence was perfect, taking 7 tricks! I supposed that meant Spade A, followed by 3 Hearts, then 3 Clubs. You might think Meckstroth's double was hard to criticize but let me tell you a little secret on how to play Precision against high level intervention: Rodwell's pass over 5D was

forcing, and, showed 2 suiters hand, here it must be the blacks. So why Meckstroth didn't bid 5S instead of double seemed complicated to me, double should only mean 2623 or 2533 particularly on this vulnerability.

莊家根本未“捕捉”台面情況，所以只拿到8墩牌，-800。也許這是專家牌手和普通牌手的區別吧。當時台面情況是：東西共有15大牌點。西叫4S，一定是有牌型，東在5H後立刻加倍，幾乎除♠的AK外，其它的大牌點，也即♥Q，♦Q，♣K多半在東家，首攻時未出♠，理論上一定沒有♠，否則有什麼理由只出以Q為首的♦套呢？所以♠和♦套，西有10張。當莊家以♦K贏得第一墩後，出♥A，西跌下♥10，這樣，幾乎肯定西是一張♥，2張♣，因為如果西的♥是Q10，東的♥是843，就無理由加倍了，這就是桌面的情況。西的牌型幾乎可以肯定為9112，如果你是這樣假定，第三墩應出♥J或♥7（不是♥K）。東被第一次投入，無論出♥，♦，♣，都要幫你一墩。如出♦，對莊家最有利（如出♣，最多一下）。明手出♦J手中墊♠，明手再出小♦手中將吃，再打♥K，再送出小♥，東被第二次投入，如這時再出♦或小♣，莊家都能完成定約。因為明手還有一寶貴的♣A進手張。這樣莊家打完所有將牌，將對東的♦和♣進行擠牌。無論如何即使東的防守正確，合約最多下一（-200分）。（讀者可自行試試）根據牌的分配，東西4S可以做成，所以-200分是好分數。澳門隊坐東西時，搶叫到5S被加倍，下一。這副牌廣州隊勝1000分14IMP。可惜的是我們沒有機會看廣州隊打5H時的表演。

The Macau North, in 5H(x), probably didn't quite "size up" the situation and had only 8 tricks for -800. An expert player would possibly analyse as this: EW had 15 points only yet vulnerable, West still bid 4S while East immediately doubled. That could only mean one thing, West had tremendous distribution in Spades and East 1-2 trump tricks and the 2 remaining honours. Further East didn't lead Spades, indication clearly a void, the D3 lead (5th best) and D2 from West showed his 9-1 in the pointed suits. Then, after HA and West 10 almost confirmed a 9-1-1-2 pattern. In fact, therefore after the first 2 tricks, declarer could have almost a clairvoyant view of the 4 hands, his 3rd trick of HJ or 7 would have thrown East in for the first time for a sure-loss exit of H, D or C. A Diamond would be disastrous: Jack and Ace in dummy to discard 2 Spades, Diamond ruff to hand, then Heart K and small to throw East in again, helplessly, his Diamond exit, whether Queen or small would help establish the suit while Club would succumb him to Queen and subsequent squeeze, CK wouldn't help, as partner's J and 10 would also be swallowed up. How about a trump

exit by East at trick 4? Well, he would be subject to an avalanche of trumps, the last 5 cards in dummy would be 2 top Diamonds and 3 top Clubs, what could East deep, do but to take Club King and surrender, again contract made! Only a small Club exit when twice thrown in with trumps could East save the day and get the contract 1 down but that would take nerves and good fast, judgement. In the other room, 5S(x) was 1 off and 14 IMPs to the better team.

In the Preliminary round of the Power Rosenblum Cup played in Montreal, August, this year, the HK. Zen Team met the No. 1 seed, the Nickell Team and had this incident, the bidding:

In Hong Kong, after West's 10+ seconds hesitation, the best action for East would be to respect that decision and pass; however, in this world's highest level of competition, with East-West world renowned players, East simply bid on. When director was called for, he ruled in favor of the Nickell Team, and when appeal led, H.K. lost again with appealing fee confiscated! (This was refunded later on) Did the H.K. Team make any mistake? We are publishing the ensuing 3 letters to let you have your opinions and a taste of what could happen in the international area.

(1) The editor bridgzette received a letter from Derek Zen on 13/Sep/2002

The editor bridgzette:

Whilst our stay in Canada was for the most part of the tournament enjoyable, it is with regret that we need to bring up an unhappy incidence regarding one appeal case.

Appear to our team that over the years, the rulings in international tournaments have been biased against less well-known NCBO players and quite some decisions are very unreasonable.

Whilst on one hand we can but trying our best to claim and protect our right with appeals, it would be educational for our members to understand the environment one would be expecting in international tournaments. This is why we would like to share with you our bitter experience in Montreal.

The three letters enclosed in chronological order is self-explanatory. We leave it to the members to judge if our criticism on WBF ruling is justified.

(2) To The Editor of the <Bridge World> 23/Aug/2002

Dear Sir,

We write to seek your opinion on the correctness of Director's ruling and subsequent appeal on the following incident at the Power Rosenblum Team event currently held in Montreal.

First of all, allow us to cite a related incident in the qualifying stage of a separate match:

At favorable vulnerability, North held - AQJxx Axxxx x xx. He heard LHO open the bidding with a strong Club, partner passed and RHO gave a positive response of 2D. At the table, he bid an unsophisticated 2S (with hindsight, 3D - getting the complete feature of the hand off his chest - might be a better treatment). LHO bid 3D and partner, holding xxxx QJx Jxxx xx, went into the think tank for a few seconds. (He later explained that he was contemplating bidding 3S/4S but was afraid this would propel opponents into a making slam.) Eventually, he chose to pass. RHO bid 3NT and North followed through with his plan by bidding 4H. This was promptly doubled by LHO and corrected to 4S by partner, also doubled. Director was summoned as soon as dummy hit the table.

As it transpired, 3NT was cold and 4S doubled went 3 light. So the sacrifice saved 3 IMPs. 10 minutes later, Director returned with this verdict: "We consulted a number of World Champions and nobody considered the bid of 4H automatic. As a result, we will correct the score to 3NT making.

North South agreed with the facts - there indeed had been a hesitation - and did not contest with the ruling.

An everyday case, you may say. So what's the problem?

In an earlier match, teammates were pitched against a pair of many times World Champions, whose star-studded squad was the runaway leaders of our Group. (In order not to embarrass any one, we decided to withhold the names of players involved, but would gladly supply them, if requested. After all, we are only seeking redress and not debating the issue of ethical behavior). This was the cause of controversy:

As you can see, the save was a profitable one, giving away only 300. In the Open Room, the same sacrifice was found via 1S - 2H - 3S - 4H - 4S - 5H - x - All Pass, pushing the board.

Back to the Closed room, the Director decided he could find nothing wrong with East-West's bidding and ruled that the result should stand. Now several members of our team had served for a number of years on the Appeals Committee of our NCBO and regularly in the PABF circuit. We were horrified. We thought in such situations, the Director would normally rule in favor of the non-offending side and let the offending side appeal. We know that the save in 5H figured to be cheap but East had asked his partner to express an opinion (by making the learned lead-directing bid of 4C) and West had chosen not to act. Was East on totally solid ground when he overrode partner's decision? Wasn't pass a *Logical Alternative* when 4S came around to him? What if partner was short in clubs and could get a ruff and the Heart Ace had stood up? Anyway, we decided to lodge an appeal but were advised by the Director that we should 'save our money'.

In case anyone gets the wrong idea, we eventually lost this match 25 - 5 and hence any chance of qualifying. We would not have qualified even if we had won this appeal so we are not trying to find a scapegoat. However, we do feel there is an issue of fairness here.

The Appeals Committee found the appeal totally groundless - in fact, the case was described as the 'Worst appeal case to-date' and, to add insult to

injury, the deposit of US\$50 was confiscated. This time, everyone was aggrieved by this application of double standards. Our confidence in the administration was, needless to say, totally shattered.

Are we wrong? Could you please comment on the ruling?

(3) Letter from Juff Rubens (24/Aug/2002)

Dear Hong Kong players,

Thank you for your letter.

Regarding it: When cases of unauthorized information boil down to judgments, people often have widely differing opinions, just as they often do on problems in the Master Solvers' Club. I tend to have different opinions from the mainstream (also just as I do in the Master Solvers' Club), and this reply encompasses only my personal opinions. Also, it is based on the facts you present as presumed undisputed.

The first ruling seems clearly correct to me. Passing is certainly a possible alternative to four hearts, and the unauthorized information seems to suggest bidding over passing (in fact, I can't think up a legitimate problem for partner that would suggest anything else). Except that this is a ruling of the same general type, unauthorized information, I don't see much relevance to the other ruling. (That there is a contrast is ordinary. Each case boils down to individual judgments about particular actions. The actions are not analogous (to me). And with different people on different committees, contrasts abound. There are no absolute standards on these things (just as in the Master Solvers Club).

The second ruling in part depends on whether advancer is always going to bid to the five level. If so, then the sequence taken is reasonable and so is the ruling. (There would be profit here in allowing a player secretly to record his intentions.) However, I can't help but suspect that the consultants were not asked the questions I would have asked. The tendency is to present the actual situation first, but I would first, but I would first ask for a choice and a plan about level. If anyone approved the plan used, I would ask them why they had not bid five clubs the first time, thus preempting as well. Were they hoping to buy the contract at four hearts? I suspect that sacrificing at five hearts regardless might be popular; the modern style is to bid a lot in

these situations. I would not see it that way, and I certainly would not bid five hearts after I had bid four clubs. First, because having bid four clubs there is a good chance that if five hearts is right partner would have bid it (actually, he has a borderline hand, as huddled, and the save is borderline as well). Second, because if I intended to bid in this situation I would have bid five clubs the first time. So considering the appeal frivolous is outrageous (and threatening people with fees to appeal is always outrageous, both in theory and because it makes wealth a part of the game). The ruling is barely plausible - I can see people thinking advancer should drive to five hearts and not thinking of five clubs the first time. But, as in many cases done after the fact, the actual advancer should have been questioned on this point. If his testimony suggests that he had not formed a five-level plan when he bid four clubs, then his five heart bid should not be allowed, because for someone who was not committed to the five level there is a logical alternative that is suggested by the unauthorized information.

(4) Third Letter: Letter To Juff Rubens (24/Aug/2002)

Dear Mr. Rubens,

Thank you analysing the situation so impartially for us. You have offered a balanced view and we truly appreciate your comments. To start with, we feel a lot better that someone like you do not see the appeal as a ridiculous one. Our fury is mostly fueled by remarks made by the Tournament Director and the original decision to confiscate the deposit. The fact that we have been told, albeit through unofficial channels at this stage, that we can now have our money back probably means the authority is taking a softer position on the case and they see the need to pacify us.

We are now demanding for an official (written) ruling of the case and the rationale for confiscating the deposit.

The dust is about to settle and this appears to be the end of it. However, over the years, our dissatisfaction with the rulings in international tournaments have been mounting. I don't want to bother you with the details but there has been past history of very unreasonable decisions, most recently in Masstricht, that if we put pen to paper, would result in a lot of red faces....

Enough said. Thanks a lot for your time.
