SOLUTION TO THREE GEMS

- (I) If declarer had 5 cards in diamonds, the slam was cold. To have a chance of defeating the contract, you had to hope that declarer was 5-1-4-3:
 - AQXXX✓ X
 - AQXX
 - AXX

Given partner's venturesome overcall at unfavourable vulnerability, there is a pretty good chance that declarer might take an inspired view and finesse the \$10. You should kill that chance by shifting to \$\mathbb{K}\$. Not even Garozzo can salvage the contract now.

(2) Why didn't South duck the first club? It looked like he had a sure entry-for instance, KJ in trumps. In that case, the ruff could not be prevented even if you guessed trumps correctly.

I am sure you can see the solution now. Eliminate hearts by playing three rounds, ruffing in dummy. Now play trumps and duck the second round. When LHO finally scored his ruff, he would be end-played. North held:

This hand was all about maintaining control. Ruff the first trick, and draw two rounds of trumps. Now leave the last trump out and play a club to the queen. This is to guard against a 5-0 break.

As it turned out, LHO withheld his ace and RHO ruffed. Back came a diamond. You ruff again and play a second club. LHO had to duck again to sever your communications. Now play a spade to force an entry to your hand. Beautifully played!

Would playing a club at trick two, work? Yes, but you would go down if the defender with only two trumps could ruff a club (e.g. RHO was 5-2-6-0 or 5-2-5-1). So, drawing two rounds of trumps would be a superior line.


Suppose you have a half pack, then South is not going to play well in 2^{\blacktriangledown} . Do you pass or try a 3^{\spadesuit} bid?

蔣鴻 bid 3♦. That could have opened a window for East to try 3H and then EW could land the 3N contract.

If you pass you will get 2 IMPS against GZ.


If you bid 34 you will tie SC or beat them by 7 IMPS if it leads to 3N.

GZ North passed and 2♥ proved to be unbeatable:




Li Yiqian doubled on the South seat in stead of IN, and then North chanced 2. The contract of course is difficult, but she may escape for 2 down. She was 3 down,

If you pass you will win IIMP as it is.

If you bid 2N you can escape for 2 down and tie the board. But that could lead to a brilliant 3\hat{\theta} bid (that is why EW would let you play 2N) from South for +110 and win 7 IMPS.

Sometimes you may get a call for an unusual action. On Board 20 both West players have the odd ball.




The clubs are friendly but the hearts are not!

3N makes, but 4♥ must go one down.



If you bid 34 you will arrive at the excellent 64 to gain 12 IMPS. (Perhaps West has helped you a little bit to find the 27-point slam)


Board 24 is a declarer problem.

You have to play 3N against silent opponents. West leads S2:9, K, Ace. MAKE A PLAN.


The teams pushed for one down but GZ was in 4.

If you let the $\triangledown Q$ win trick 2 you make 3N and get 10 IMPS for SC.

In the match Li Yiqian played for hearts 3-3 or 4-2 and overtook the \PQ . She could not recover from the bad position after that. However, her line might not be inferior to yours, because you rely on other conditions:



Sometimes you may get an inspiration for a friendly break. But the friendly break did not come. SC gave away 6 IMPS when the bidding went 1N-3N with the NS cards:




(1) Suppose you Pass, then declarer is not going to play well in 3N. Do you double and risk a correction from North? Both West players passed.

East led the HK, declarer ducked, and partner continued with the HT.




Therefore,

- (I) If you double 3N, South will run away for 4♣ and you can get +200 if you double again as you should have planned. You will lose 3IMPS to GZ and tie SC.
- (2) If you discard 2 clubs, you tie GZ and win 3 IMPS over SC.




North has 2 majors and partner makes a take-out double over 2.

To pass would be heroic but horrible. Do you try 2N, 3 o or 3 o?

GZ East bid $3 \stackrel{\bullet}{\bullet}$ in the match and West duly bid 3N with the $\stackrel{\bullet}{\bullet}K$.

It did not work well, because there were not enough quick tricks even after the \(\Delta K \).



Actually the same 5 bids occurred on the other table. Zhu Pingbid a simple $3 \stackrel{\bullet}{\Rightarrow}$, and then she made 10 tricks in $3 \stackrel{\bullet}{\circ}$.

Shanghai Chiche 21 GZ Chujiang 10

If you bid 2N you still go one down to lose the same 5 IMPS. If you bid 34 you tie S4.

If you bid 3^{\bullet} partner will get the same fate as the declarer for GZ, losing 5 IMPS.

When would partner bypass a4-card major suit? One of the pairs must have a better understanding on this situation, as evidenced by these two unexpected sequences. Both are Precision pairs.
