



With 3NT making five in the Closed Room, Nangang Power had a good start for the first 2 IMPs of this match. It was more interesting in the match between Mickey Two Clubs and New Chi for this board.

The story began with first lead of $\lozenge 5$ by West. Declarer accepted the free finesse of \lozenge and took the first trick in hand. $\clubsuit A$ was cashed to avoid $\lozenge A$ being ruffed later on by opponent with a singleton trump. $\triangledown Q$ was not covered but Yiu of the Mickey Two Clubs team decided to let it run, rather than ruffing finesse East for $\triangledown K$. He went to dummy via $\lozenge A$ and discarded the losing \spadesuit in hand on $\triangledown A$. A \spadesuit was ruffed and the fourth \lozenge was ruffed in dummy when West did not ruff with his $\clubsuit K$. After ruffing a \triangledown to hand, Yiu could clear trumps and claimed. When the New Chi pair at the other table missed game, Mickey Two Clubs chalked up 13 IMPs and went on to eliminate New Chi to go into semi-final.



In the Closed Room, 2° was destined to go down after East first drew two rounds of trump. In the Open Room, declarer had just one sure entry to dummy but he needed to take quite a few finesses in order to make 3NT. So, he had no choice but to rely on finessing $\clubsuit K$ as well. When North came up with that card, 3NT went down three. 9 IMPs went away to New Chi.

Board 5. Dealer North. NS Vul.



In the Open Room, after East made a thin takeout double, West had a rosy picture on the combined hands and started to explore slam. However, his partner turned out to have an average hand and they could not stop at $4\heartsuit$, the only makeable game contract. $5\diamondsuit$ went just one down when North played declarer for shortness in \heartsuit and did not give his partner a \heartsuit ruff.

In the Closed Room, $3\heartsuit$ should be made with an overtrick if declarer drew one round of trump by leading small to $\heartsuit Q$, losing just 3 trump tricks. At the table, declarer finessed $\heartsuit J$ after the first lead of singleton \clubsuit was taken in hand. Upon return of $\spadesuit Q$, declarer embarked on cross ruff but North ruffed the second \clubsuit trick and drew two more rounds of trump as well as two more \spadesuit winners. $3\heartsuit$ went down two and Nangang Power gained 2 IMPs. What a relief to the Gan/Shi pair when they knew board 5 was a winning board indeed.

Board 7. Dealer South. All Vul.



3NT cannot be made on passive lead because declarer is short of entry to dummy to finesse ♥T before cashing ♣. Gan of the Nangang Power team did that, rewarded by 12 IMPs, when that was not copied by Mickey Two Clubs.

Only a few overtricks IMPs exchanged between the two teams later. Nangang Power was leading by 9 IMPs after the first segment.

Quarter Final: Segment 2 Dragonite vs Nangang Power

With 14 boards to go, Nangang Power was leading by 9 IMPs.



Without and lead directing double by North, it was very difficult for South to lead \Diamond first but in the Closed Room, Chris of the Dragonite team still had a second chance for shifting to \Diamond when he came in with \triangle A. 3NT up one here and two undertricks in the Open Room were equivalent to 12 IMPs.

If I were Leo in the Closed Room, I would have bid $6\heartsuit$ after the balancing double by partner which virtually guaranteed two aces, judging from the first pass to the initial pre-empt of $3\diamondsuit$. In the Open Room, declarer played for both \clubsuit honours with West or any 3-2 break with split \clubsuit honours. Two trump tricks and the \diamondsuit set this contract of $5\clubsuit$ by one, enabling Dragonite to get back 13 IMPs.

Board 19. Dealer South. EW Vul.



In the Open Room, since East doubled the final contract of $5\clubsuit$, declarer played him for $\clubsuit Q$ and went down one. While $4\spadesuit$ went just one down on a \heartsuit lead in the Closed Room, this meant another 5 IMPs for Dragonite who was behind just by 3 IMPs.

In the Open Room, the declarer was under no pressure after East returned his singleton $\lozenge J$ after a \clubsuit was led by West. He quickly chalked up 11 tricks.

In the Closed Room, East continued another \clubsuit to shorten declarer's trumps in hand. \spadesuit A and another trump from dummy caught \spadesuit J from East. As the cards lay, declarer could cater for the 4-1 break in trump by ducking this, losing another trump when dummy could ruff on the \spadesuit force. Chris explained that he thought he could not cater for both 4-1 break in \spadesuit & \Diamond at the same time. So, he took the second trump trick with \spadesuit K and played on \Diamond , couping East if he had more than $2 \Diamond$. Actually, East ruffed the second \Diamond , returned \heartsuit J to set up the fourth and setting trick while the defence still held control in trump to stop any discard on the good \Diamond . 13 IMPs were gained by Nangang Power.

In the Closed Room, declarer took the trump lead with $\Diamond K$ and put in $\clubsuit T$ when North did not show up with $\clubsuit A$. Another trump was returned to hand, followed by ruffing finesse of $\clubsuit A$ with dummy's last trump. Declarer came back to hand by $\heartsuit A$ to draw the outstanding trump. Declarer cashed two more rounds of trumps and South discarded two \clubsuit and a \heartsuit . When $\clubsuit Q$ was cashed, South let go another \heartsuit . Would you arrive at the same conclusion Shi Xiao of the Nangang Power team did that South had $\spadesuit Qxx$ and $\heartsuit K$ in the 4-card ending? As a result, $6 \diamondsuit$ went down three. Very nice defence marvellously engineered by Chris Fung of the Dragonite team who earned their side 12 IMPs. In fact, Dragonite was just 1 IMP behind after this board.

This could be the decisive board for this match. To defeat $4\heartsuit$, East must lead away from $\diamondsuit K$ in the first trick so that when he takes the first trump trick with his $\heartsuit A$, he can give partner $a \diamondsuit ruff$ while there is still another loser in \diamondsuit and \clubsuit .


In the Open Room, Patrick Yum of the Dragonite team could have visualized this line of defence since his partner had already shown 10 cards for his two suiters hand. It would be even better if CC Cheung of the Dragonite team showed which minor he had after South's 3NT bid. Anyway, the phantom sacrifice of 4 ± 100 could still have earned their team a place in the semifinal because their teammates also made 4 % in the Closed Room. If perfect defence could be found, they would get 13 IMPs. On the other hand, if they sacrificed in 4 ± 100 (which went down one only), they would still get 9 IMPs from this board instead of losing 5 IMPs.

On the last board, the Dragonite pair in the Open Room was one level too high in game after discovering they did not have any slam prospects. IO IMPs were lost and Nangang Power advanced to the next stage after winning this match by 16 IMPs.

Moment of Truth

Before the last board was played in the semi-final match between Cre8ive and Mickey Two Clubs. Mickey Two Clubs was still trailing by 7 IMPs.

Board 30. Dealer East. None Vul.



4♠ was reached at both tables. Play was finished in the Open Room first: 4♠ by Cre8ive down one. If Kongo Kong of the Mickey Two Clubs team can make his contract, they will get 10 IMPs from this board, enough for them to book a place in their first ever Intercity Open Team final.

Everything hinged on getting the trumps right. While everyone in the Secretariat Room were keeping our fingers crossed, a small & was played to &K, exactly the same as what the Cre8ive declarer had done in the Open Room moment before. Next came another & towards &AJT. Everyone around was crying out for &A. If you were around on the second floor by 6:30 pm, you might perhaps be shocked by our sudden scream. The VU-graph operator had been testing our nerves and it seemed ages before finally the &T was played. What a disappointment to the local players whose lives have been disrupted by protests all these days.

Anyway, life goes on.

May we wish Cre8ive better luck in the second Intercity Open Team final they are in !

Dragonite 队南北 2NT 开叫后的 3C 既然不是问 5 张高花,为什么北家要叫 3C 呢?叫牌过程帮助了西家甘信立不选择攻红心。甘信立选择了首攻小草花,庄家借不到任何外力帮助,3NT 宕一。也是 1/4 决赛 8 桌中唯一的宕桌。



在八方新气的桌上,南家主打 3NT,看上去也是很不错的定约,然而结果居然是宕 4!! 东家在桌上 8 分牌开叫 1C!!东家首攻草花,庄家选择方块敲东家单张 K。大坝决口...

又一个低点牌开叫并且获利的故事。



南家首攻 S10,但防守方总是能够找到正确 方向攻击方块。3NT 宕 2。

北家孙少林对 3NT 进行耐特尔加倍, 聂老根据同伴指令, 准确的首攻出方块。3NT 加倍宕 2。

在深圳南港动力对阵 Dragonite 队闭室,施晓主打 3NT,南家在 SA 上手后换攻出 C9,出卖了同伴。施晓抓住战机双飞北家草花QJ,吃到 4 墩草花、2 墩黑桃、3 墩红心。完成定约。



Ambassador 队北家吴庭吉第 4 家开叫 2H 显示中强牌。由于 SQ 和 HQ 位置都对,南北能吃到 12 墩牌。但桌上的庄家以安全为主,最终 4H 超一。

Ambassador 队东西方的阻击很凶,一下子把高度抬到 5 阶。好在聂老力挽狂澜,勇敢的叫出 5S,抢到定约。(如果加倍能惩罚到5D,防守正确能吃到 7 墩,5DX-5,得1100,获利更多)

东家鞠传成首攻 DQ, 西家招伟力 DA 吃住后换出小草花, 聂老不敢懈怠, CA 吃住, 东家掉出 CK。调将牌, SK 再 SJ 勇敢飞过 (Q10xx 在西家永远打不成), 发现将牌 3-3 后, 聂老送草花让定约安全回家。

北家首攻将牌,暗手吃进后出小草花,北家 得墩后再攻将牌,庄家出 CQ,北家 CK 大 后出红心损了一墩牌,庄家方块和草花各失 2墩,4S 宕 1。

聂老再出手挽狂澜! 仰仗着局况有利,而且自己已经 pass 过头的牌,4NT 积极抢定约! 一不小心居然是铁牌(南家主打,6H 居然都是成牌)

东西方的红心和草花均为 2-2 分布,HA 位置有利,防守方无能为力。5CX 正成。

这副牌吉利汽车赢得 10 IMP。1/4 淘汰赛, 吉利汽车队 68 比 33 胜 Ambassador 队进军 半决赛。



北家首攻 DA, 庄家甘信立将吃, HAK 调将发现将牌偏北家 4 张, 出草花到桌上 CA, 继续奔吃草花, 利用明手最后的 H10 将牌, 对北家的将牌 Q7 进行擒将打法。防守方只能吃到 1 墩将牌和 2 墩黑桃。4H 正成。1/4 决赛的 8 桌中, 共 5 桌东西打 4H 定约,均成功完成定约。
